<u>Rachel Marie Lewis</u>, who burst onto the scene in 2012 for her leading role in the eight-time indie award nominee Transatlantic Coffee, stars as Maggie Conley. <u>Christian Oliver</u> (The Good German, Speed Racer) stars opposite Lewis as Chris Conley. He also produced the film with de Golyer and Mark Rickard.

"It's a psychological roller coaster," Lewis said. "It was more emotionally draining than anything I've worked on. It's eerie and the kind of movie that you need to watch twice. It's definitely something that's going to have its surprises."

Oliver said, "We always approached it as a tragic love story. It's a psychological thriller that is a

reflection of the good and evil in all of us. Maggie and Chris are yearning for love and recognition that we all essentially look for."
