

DMCA introduces government entities to 'Implementing Regulations' for licensing of marine craft in Dubai

Al Jourani further shed light on DMCA's key contributions to boosting the industry's competitiveness through the adoption of best international practices and regulations based on comprehensiveness and efficiency to build an attractive maritime investment environment and therefore promote Dubai's leading position on the global landscape.

Mohammed Al-Bastaki, Director of Maritime Operations, Dubai Maritime City Authority, spoke about the maritime activities entrusted to DMCA, including the allocation of dedicated coastal zone areas to facilitate access to the various marine craft, allocation of new anchorage areas, vessel refueling, marine buoys and warning signs system management and other initiatives that contribute to maritime safety and secure navigation.

Adel Kalantar, Head of Registration and Licensing Department, Dubai Maritime City Authority, introduced the audience to the licensing and registration mechanisms covering recreational, tourism and commercial craft and traditional wooden dhows, which is subject to compliance with Dubai's technical specifications, maritime safety systems and requirements. DMCA also has the capacity to issue relevant resolutions and regulations governing maritime activities in territorial waters, in line with the best international maritime practices.

Amer Ali, Executive Director, Dubai Maritime City Authority, said: "It is important to abide by the regulations for licensing marine craft in Dubai's regional waters as stipulated by the Implementing

Regulations aimed at organizing the local maritime industry under the best international practices and the highest levels of maritime safety, environmental security and safe navigation, in line with the directives of H.H. Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai. DMCA remains committed to leveraging our strong strategic relations with its partners, as part of our efforts to adopt best practices to optimise performance and promote Dubai's maritime industry at the local, regional and international levels."
