"We have never voluntarily released any information about our users and any local, state, or federal government agency requesting customer data must have a legally search warrant or subpoena to do so. Of the millions of users we have served, we have never provided information about any individual voluntarily.

When someone's hard drive crashes it's not like they can ask the NSA for a backup of their data. We provide free cloud storage, backup services and synchronization between internet capable devices – all free from open government scrutiny."
