

Charges Filed in Fatal Houston Car Accident After Man Runs Stop Sign

According to a [KHOU News report](#), the 20-year-old man fled the scene on foot along with the passenger of the pickup he was driving after striking the victim's vehicle when he ran the stop sign. The victim, a 46-year-old male, was pronounced dead at the scene. The suspect has been charged with intoxication manslaughter.

In addition to driving under the influence, the attorneys note, failing to obey traffic signs, and choosing to flee the scene as opposed to summoning help for those injured are life-altering decisions that never result in a happy ending for innocent victims or those committing the egregious acts.

In cases where charges are filed in connection with a serious accident, injured parties likely will have legal standing to file a personal injury claim for any damages that have been incurred as a result. If an accident is fatal, then the surviving family members may be able to pursue a wrongful death claim on their behalf.
