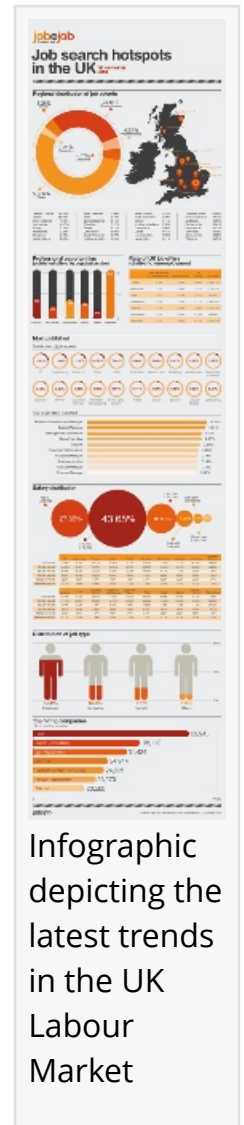
IT and Engineering rule

Over 18.5% of the millions of job adverts published on Jobisjob.co.uk between Jan – Jun are related to IT. Additionally over 50% of the job offers published in the first half of this year fall into the categories of IT, Engineering, Finance and Sales. This bodes well for individuals looking to work in these sectors considering that the UK employment rate is still hovering around 7.7%. Although the unemployment rate is falling in 2013, and there are positive signs of economic recovery, the North East and North West are still seeing higher unemployment levels than the South East and London respectively. This is reflected in the infographic by the regional distribution of job adverts as the highest percentages are being published in the greater London area.

Business related job titles and Permanent positions are in demand

Business Development Managers, Project Managers, Account Managers and Sales Executives are the most sought after roles at the moment. The trend is expected to continue in the second half of 2013. According to recent reports, figures show people looking for work in the UK are accepting part time positions because of the lack of [full time positions](#) available. The results of the infographic contradict this and show that the most predominant type of positions being offered right now are both full time and permanent. Recruitment agencies agree; depending on the industry the UK has a healthy labour market, and work is available especially in the sectors detailed above.
