

King Mohammed VI and President Hollande share their concern over C. Africa

King Mohammed VI and French President Hollande express concerned over violence in the Central African Republic (CAR)

MOROCCO, MOROCCO, December 27, 2013 /EINPresswire.com/ -- In a framework of mutual consultation between Morocco and France, King Mohammed VI had on Tuesday a phone conversation with President Hollande on the latest developments of the situation in the Central African Republic.
