We want to see a step change in organisational cyber security behaviours."

Alan Calder, Founder and Executive Chairman of IT Governance, says: "The Cyber Essentials Scheme will play an important role in creating a baseline of cyber security measures for British organisations. We welcome the fact that the five security controls set by the scheme are based on ISO27001, the international information security management standard."

Speakers from BCS, ISACA and SGS will give talks at the event titled "Cyber Essentials – The UK Government Scheme to improve cyber security", which is aimed at organisations of all types and sizes who are looking for an early or mid-term adoption of the Scheme.
