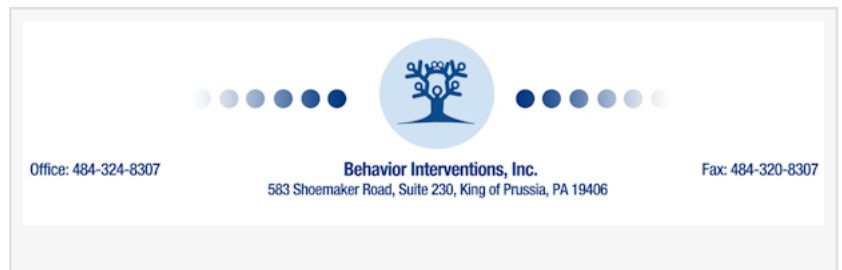


Behavior Interventions, Inc. Opening an ABA Treatment Center

CDC's Autism and Developmental Disability Monitoring Network collected data and confirmed the continued rise in Autism prevalence in the 2014 report.
