The majority of the iPhones that are released for the users in the market tend to be locked with a particular carrier. Although many 'factory unlocked' devices are released; but the number is too less compared to the locked models. The act of Jailbreaking or rooting can be extremely frustrating. Undoubtedly the stake of using any SIM in your iPhone is much greater than the frustration. What happens with rooting is that the baseband of the device is changed and thus the iPhone will now support any SIM card that you insert.

Rooting or Jailbreaking an iPhone cannot be termed as a simple or a difficult job as the level of work load put in depends on the condition of the device itself and the carrier that it has in the locked state. In most of the cases the mobile phone provider, themselves will unlock the device for you once the deal with the carrier is complete. But that tends to take some amount of time and that is the main reason why people go for company like Unlock.

Jailbreaking the iPhone 5s, 5c, iOS 7.1.1 in a mobile device context, is the use of an exploit to remove manufacturer or carrier restrictions from a device such as an iPhone or iPad. The good news is that new software to Unlock iPhone 5c, 5s, 5, 4S iOS 7.1.1 to iOS 7 is available using a new IPSW Exploit. This exploit changes the lock-state table in the seczone to read unlocked and created a spoofed RSA token that was seen as valid by bootloader 3.9 (4.6 was not vulnerable to IPSF). It overwrote your previous token, which means the phone could no longer be officially unlocked, unless a restore of the token was performed from a previously made backup. Since the token isn't modified in a baseband

flash, this unlock survived a baseband downgrade or upgrade. Apple attempted to combat this by requiring AT+CLCK command to be sent every startup. In an officially unlocked iPhones, lockdown does this. In a late version IPSF phone, signal app does this and installs the Cydia Installer where you can software unlock your iPhone.

Jailbreaking is the process of removing restrictions in iOS, and allow root access to the iOS file system so that it can run software that has not been approved by Apple. It allows users to install jailbreak apps, tweaks and themes from Cydia to customize the look and feel of their device, and also enhance the functionality.

Once done you will realize that your iPhone is still behaving as it is locked still. Just follow the steps mentioned below.

1. After the unlock is completed make sure you back up your iPhone by connecting it to your computer and using iTunes to perform a backup.
2. Then completely reset your device by going to Settings > General > Reset > Erase All Content and Settings. Everything will be wiped from your iPhone following this process, so backing up your iPhone is EXTREMELY important to do first.
3. You can now complete the setup assistant on your iPhone and restore your iPhone from the backup you created. Insert your new SIM card.

Once you have followed the above steps, all that is left to be done is restart the device using a new SIM.
