

## Sacramento Surgeon Touts Study on Quality of Life Post-Breast Augmentation

<u>The study</u>, whose results were published in a recent issue of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery<sup>®</sup>, concluded that "breast augmentation is associated with high patient satisfaction and significant improvements in quality of life."

"This study underscores what I've heard from my patients throughout my career," says Dr. Yamahata, who's regarded as one of the top plastic surgeons in the Sacramento Valley. "Women say they enjoy looking more feminine and feeling confident in different kinds of clothing after breast augmentation."

According to statistics from the American Society of Plastic Surgeons<sup>®</sup>, breast augmentation is the most common cosmetic surgery performed in the U.S., with about 290,000 surgeries performed nationwide last year.

Dr. Yamahata says his patients benefit from the extensive time he devotes to their consultations, ensuring they have all their questions answered and that he understands their specific cosmetic goals. The consultation, he says, is where successful plastic surgery results begin.

"For example," Dr. Yamahata says, "the study suggests that patients who are older and those who get breast implants inserted behind their pectoral muscles often needed more time to recover than they expected, and so their satisfaction was lower even if they had good results cosmetically. That's why I spend so much time with patients who have questions <u>about breast</u> <u>implants</u> at my consultations in Sacramento and Roseville. I want to cover every topic and potential concern so they know what to expect."

Dr. Yamahata says his patients make decisions about breast augmentation surgery based on a

thorough understanding of their options, including the advantages and potential complications of each alternative. He says patient education is intertwined with patient satisfaction.

"If you know what to expect as a patient, then you'll be better prepared for the challenges of recovery," Dr. Yamahata says. "The more people know, the easier it is for them to move past concern and start to feel excited about their transformation."
