

AmpClamp, Simple Practicality

The [AmpClamp guitar stand](#) is just such a design. It is planned to keep fine musical instruments safely displayed on stage or in between practice sessions at home without taking up valuable floor space or endangering performers.

The AmpClamp begins with a base part that resembles a carpenter's bar clamp. This means it can attach quickly and firmly to almost anything. From this base a sturdy bar extends upward, and a standard two-prong guitar hanger can be folded down from it. As the name implies, a good place to fasten the AmpClamp is to an amplifier. Since amps are likely to already be onstage or near the stage, and they are very sturdy, in moments the stand can be securely anchored to one – ready for your guitar when you need a place to put it. Since the stand is now using the same floor space as the amplifier, your guitar is no longer competing with performers for a place on stage. This means that not



only is your instrument safer, but so are the other performers on stage. No more chance for tripping over the legs of a guitar stand and breaking an ankle at the least convenient moment possible. "Break a leg" should be only a means of wishing a performer good luck. It should not become an actual event on stage.

Speaking of performers, the AmpClamp is endorsed by guitarist, Bobby Cochran. Cochran played with such well known bands as Steppenwolf and Leon Russell, and now has a successful independent career as a musician, producer, singer and songwriter.

Less equipment on stage means less to breakdown and put away at the end of the show. The AmpClamp is a star here, too, because it folds up compactly and is easy to stow with your other gear. Anyone who has ever tried to pack up a high school band and had difficulty loading the big bass drum knows the value of compact storage.
