Ticket holders have the option of daily bar hopping on the main street or enjoying the free transport provided to deliver them to the outer venues of their choice. There will also be access to free transport after the festival finishes each night.

Promoter Gavin "Butto" Butlin says, "this has been a vision of mine for years and I wanted to create a festival for everyone who loves live music. The average age of the locals in Airlie Beach is 37 years

and so there is a great vibe about the place and there are not many towns in Australia where you can find so many bars and music venues in one small strip. The setting is awesome, the music is magic, the climate is perfect and everyone has a brilliant time. Last year people were coming up to me and saying it was the best weekend's entertainment they have had in years so all I can say is come along and see for yourself."

Ticket prices are very reasonable at \$120 for a one day pass which gets you into all venues and one day of the main stage performances or \$260 three day pass including all festival events. For the main
