"Obesity is a risk factor for hernia development and is associated with hernia recurrence rates of up to 50 percent. Repairing complex abdominal wall defects in patients with obesity, who often have two chronic conditions, can be challenging," explained Dr. Moses Shieh, founder of the Surgical Healing Arts Center (www.surgicalhealingarts.com).

"What I concluded was that the use of acellular bovine pericardium or ABP, in complex abdominal wall reconstruction in patients with obesity had a high rate of success and low rates of recurrence and complications."
