


Local author Scott Kalberg signs book with Tate Publishing

Twelve years from my vision I was visiting some churches here and there. I had visited three different churches where I felt led to go up... the pastor asked if there was anyone who wanted to come up and get prayed for. I had never met these pastors before in my life, nor have they ever met me before. When I went up each time I was prophesied over that I was going to be a minister! I knew then that this was my calling from God," said Kalhberg.

Born on February 17th 1989 from Gallipolis, Ohio, Scott was abandoned, neglected, and abused by his biological parents. He was taken away by Child Services at the age of one and sent to foster care. At the age of four, Scott was adopted by the Kalbergs when his foster family could no longer take care of him.

The Kalbergs taught Scott about God and His undying love for him. Since then, God has always been the center of his inspiration. Through volunteering to help with handicaps and joining outreach activities, Scott hopes to be a light for others to thank God for all that He has done for him.
