### 1. Change Your Air Filter

Check your filter every month, especially during heavy use months (winter and summer). At a minimum, change the filter every three months. A dirty filter will slow down air flow and make the system work harder to keep you warm and waste energy. A clean filter will also prevent dust and dirt from building up in the system.

## 2. Tune up HVAC Equipment Annually

Just as a tune-up for your car can improve your gas mileage, a yearly tune-up of your heating and cooling system can improve efficiency and comfort.

## 3. Install a Programmable Thermostat

A programmable thermostat is ideal for people who are away from home during set periods of time. Through proper use of pre-programmed settings, a programmable thermostat can save you more than \$150 every year in energy costs.

#### 4. Seal Heating & Cooling Ducts

Ducts that move air to-and-from a central air conditioner or heat pump are often big energy wasters. Sealing and insulating ducts can improve the efficiency of your heating and cooling system by as much as 20 percent.

5. Consider Installing New Energy Efficient Heating Equipment If your HVAC equipment is more than 10 years old, or not keeping your house comfortable, have it evaluated by a professional HVAC contractor. Replacing your old heating and cooling equipment with energy efficient equipment (that are "ENERGY STAR" qualified) can cut your annual energy bill by nearly \$200.

"Heat pumps are an example of the new energy efficient equipment that is gaining in popularity in Florida," said Gouty. "A heat pump pulls from the ground or outside air temperature to heat your home – it's a reliable, efficient choice in the South."

A heat pump transports constantly moving warm air from one place to another, to where it's needed or not needed. Even in air that seems cold, heat energy is present. When it's cold outside a heat pump extracts this outside heat and transfers it inside. One advantage of a heat pump is that it moves heat instead of generating heat, making it more energy efficiency. Heat pumps are powered by electricity, so fuel consumption is reduced. For example, a Trane XL20i heat pump is among the HVAC industry's most efficient, with a rating up to 19.00 SEER and 9.00 HSPF.

"Heat pumps are best for moderate climates, like Florida," said Gouty. "What make the timing ideal is that right now Trane is offering some sizeable rebates – up to \$2,500 – toward the purchase of new equipment."
