The Weekly Leaf does not report on celebrity gossip, sports events or even national or international disasters – other than as humanitarian issues.

The Weekly Leaf does report on democratic capitalism, ongoing financial considerations, education, humanitarian efforts, journalism and freedom of expression, international affairs, healthcare, safety and security, child well-being, technology, conflict resolution, policy challenges and similar sorts of topics. It focuses on accurately reporting both background and current events that can have far-reaching effects in our society.

the Weekly LeafMaterial published in the Weekly Leaf is created by journalists, analysts and editors – real people who examine the issues and state them in accessible language. It is available online or as an app for phones and tablets. The goal is to provide impartial, unbiased news to provide information to concerned citizens who wish to be well-informed voters. It is funded through donations.

Funds obtained from the Weekly Leaf [Kickstarter crowdfunding campaign](#) will be used to pay staff writers and to increase the amount and frequency of content. The target amount is \$25,000; any funds over that amount will be used to bring new writers on board.

Mr. Romain founded the Weekly Leaf and is committed to continuing it because (as previously

mentioned) he feels that unbiased reporting is essential to the democratic process. He believes that the American public is disenchanted with sensational journalism, gossip, mud-slinging and other forms of irresponsible newspaper publication. He cites a 2014 Gallup poll as indicating that citizens have little faith in the accuracy or objectivity of current news sources. He believes that in order to accurately deliver unbiased information, it needs to be filtered by experienced journalists and analysts who are committed to delivering only truthful accounts that do not exaggerate situations, and that will focus on major issues rather than on day-to-day events that are selected for their titillation value.

A quick scan of current issues of the Weekly Leaf reveals topics such as commentary on the mid-term elections, use of the teen fan-base to advertise the Mockingjay, treatment of minorities in Asia, NATO response to the Ukraine, and US voter disenfranchisement.

If you are too busy to spend hours reading a variety of magazines and newspapers to glean in-depth reporting, but value unbiased, thoughtful reporting, the Weekly Leaf might be just the digital news platform for you.
