

Report: Women Experience Sexual Stigma When Infected with HPV; CBCD Comments on the Report


Women with HPV were twice as likely to experience a perceived stigma. (1)

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"Infected with the human papillomavirus (HPV)? The CBCD recommends taking Novirin or Gene-Eden-VIR." - Greg Bennett, CBCD

Research suggests that having an infection with the human papillomavirus (HPV) negatively affects sexual wellbeing. Interestingly, a new study found that there is an association between a woman's history of sexually transmitted infections (STI) and the level of sexual stigma (condemnation by peers resulting in alienation and prejudice) that she experiences. (1) Dr. Panagiotis Papalambros describes the effects of this stigma, writing in an article that "HPV affects both personal and interpersonal dynamics and in many occasions leads to social stigma, a state of exclusion and trauma." (See Academia.edu) (2) He continues, writing that "Psychological consequences of the disease and lack of information may lead to depression, stress, shame, sexuality distortion, blame, suspicion and loss of partner intimacy." (2) Dr. Papalambros is a gynecologist from the University of the Aegean.





The CBCD therefore recommends that infected individuals take Novirin or Gene-Eden-VIR, two natural antivirals that were shown to reduce herpes symptoms in two separate post-marketing clinical studies.

Are there treatments available against the HPV?

"There are no drugs approved against the HPV. Current treatments include procedures, such as cryotherapy, conization, and the Loop Electrosurgical Excision Procedure (LEEP). These procedures use liquid nitrogen, a surgical knife (scalpel), a carbon dioxide (CO2) laser, or electrical current to remove the abnormal growths caused by the HPV. These growths include cells that harbor the active virus. The procedures do not target cells with the latent virus. Since they do not remove the latent virus, these procedures only produce a temporary remission." (3) In contrast, Novirin and Gene-Eden-VIR were designed to target the latent HPV.

"We recommend that individuals concerned about HPV and genital warts, and the stigma associated with this viral disease, take Novirin or Gene-Eden-VIR." - Greg Bennett, CBCD
