

# Death by HPV and Skin Cancer; The CBCD Examines a Recent Study

Some HPV types may be linked to skin cancer. These growths include cells that harbor the active virus. The procedures do not target cells with the latent virus. Since they do not remove the latent virus, these procedures only produce a temporary remission." (5) In contrast, the formula of Novirin was designed to target the latent HPV.
