


McDonald's Corporation Partners With CAEL On New 'Archways To Opportunity' Initiative

<u>services</u> to help students at all levels meet their education goals. Students will first be matched with and then meet with an education advisor who will help them evaluate education opportunities that take into consideration short and long term goals. The advisor will also help them evaluate how well the opportunities suit their needs and maximize what they have already accomplished.
