

Four 'Emerging Investigator Grantees' Named by FightSMA and Gwendolyn Strong Foundation

Cumulative Total Tops \$500,000 for Awards for Cutting-Edge Spinal Muscular Atrophy Research

The awards, created by the two research-funding organizations, were conceived to draw innovative, next-generation talent into SMA research, according to FightSMA Chair Mike Calise.

"To date, we've granted 15 Emerging Investigator awards to twelve researchers totaling over \$500,000," said Calise.

The four winners were chosen from a field of promising young investigators, ranging from recent PhD graduates engaged in post-doctoral fellowships up to assistant professors within the first two years of their appointment.

"We're very proud to make these awards for a third straight year," said Bill Strong, co-founder of the Gwendolyn Strong Foundation. "Our objective is to provide critical seed funding to ensure that emerging talent and fresh approaches are encouraged and supported."

"We've been gratified by the excitement that these awards generate in the SMA research community each year," he said. "The grantees are extraordinarily talented and deserve our support."

The four winners were announced at the annual FightSMA research conference held April 9-11, 2015 in Washington, D.C. Each of the researchers will receive a \$27,500 award. They are:

- Dr. Anne Rietz, Indiana University
- Dr. Eileen Workman, Columbia University
