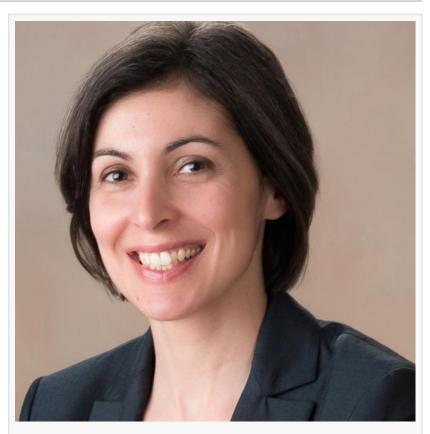


## Sehaam Caselberg of SC Coaching & Consulting to be Featured on CUTV News Radio
