

Dentists Report More Oral HPV Cancers; the CBCD Reviews the Medical Evidence

The Oral Cancer Foundation warns that oral cancer is typically hard to diagnose because in early stages, it may not be noticed by the patient." (3) The CBCD recommends that individuals
