

A Herpes Virus is Linked to Severe Chest Pain; CBCD Reviews a Report

A study showed a link between a herpes virus and a disorder called angina. (1)

A study linked the Roseola virus, which is a member in the herpes family of viruses, with severe chest pain in individuals who have a disorder called angina. According to the U.S. National Library of Medicine, the chest pain and discomfort of angina from blocked blood vessels is a symptom of heart disease. clinical studies that followed FDA guidelines. The studies showed that the formula is effective against the herpes family of viruses.
