

Herpes: One Reason Your Vagina Hurts; The CBCD Reviews the Medical Evidence



(1) Dr. Joseph Maurice adds to Dr. Minkin's warnings, writing that "infectious causes of acute vulvar pain include ... acute genital herpes." (2) The vulva is the outer part of the vagina. Once infected, the initial outbreak can be so severe that hospitalization is required. Dr. Maurice continued, writing that, "Primary genital herpes infections can be

extremely painful with an accompanying





flu-like illness; patients may require admission for intravenous, antiviral therapy and pain management." (2)

WebMD notes that when the pain is not severe enough for hospital admission, women can take an over-the-counter pain reliever, "such as aspirin, acetaminophen, or ibuprofen." (3) Additionally,

"doctors sometimes recommend soaking the affected area in warm water. But the area should be kept dry most of the time. If toweling off after bathing is uncomfortable, try using a hair moisture better than synthetic fabric does." (3)
