

## HPV Infects Both Men and Women; The CBCD Reviews the Medical Evidence


"The risk of HPV infection is exactly the same in men and women," according to the South African Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists. (1)

These growths include cells that harbor the active virus. The procedures do not target cells with the latent virus. Since they do not remove the latent virus, these procedures only produce a temporary remission." (2) In contrast, Novirin and Gene-Eden-VIR were designed to target the latent HPV.
