

The Florida Panthers and Eastern Air Lines team up to provide a cargo recovery flight for the government of the Bahamas

The Bahamas - The Florida Panthers and Eastern Air Lines, working in partnership with The Bahamas Ministry of Tourism, today flew a joint mission to the island of Exuma. The mission was led by the Ministry of Tourism's Director General, Joy Jibrilu, to bring supplies purchased and donated in South Florida donated by Bahamian tourism sector partners as well as donors in Nassau and Grand Bahama Island, wanting to contribute to the Hurricane relief effort. The Flight originated from Miami International Airport, where over 5 tons of supplies were loaded aboard Eastern's 737-700, The Spirit of the American Soldier, which is used primarily by the Florida Panthers for their road trips.
