"Collaboration across care settings was associated with better monitoring for comorbidities and complications as well more appropriate prescribing of cardiac medications," Dr. Gupta said.

According to Dr. Gupta, while 26 million



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Americans suffer from some form of chronic kidney disease, the most are in the earliest stages of the condition, and can generally receive adequate monitoring and care from their PCPs alone.
