

"Asian Super Team: Team Up for Good" in Chiayi

Elites from Six National Teams Enter Farming and Fishing Villages for the Running Man Challenges.

Not only do they have to carefully cut-out oysters to win first place in the "oyster award," they also have to exert team spirit and successfully weigh out 10 kg of sea salt. In addition to the two fishery salt contests, contestants from the six countries also highlighted the theme of the event—the "Report for Good Deeds" spirit in the pulp-stepping operation to help repair the Zhou Nan Salt Field.
