


Genital Herpes TEDx Talk Discusses HSV Stigma; The CBCD Reviews the Video

Ella Dawson, a 23 year old with genital herpes, discusses HSV infections and the social stigma associated with them. (1)

A strong stigma is associated with genital herpes infection. Now, through an independently organized TED Talk, Ella Dawson discusses the HSV infection while on a "mission to end the stigma that surrounds STIs (that cause) sufferers to avoid seeking treatment." (1) Many health care professionals are now working to help end that stigma because of the negative impact it has on the emotional and mental health of the infected individual. As Ms. Dawson notes in her speech, "People with herpes, in my mind, were dishonest, irresponsible, promiscuous, unfaithful ... what I learned very quickly was that (this) really intense, deeply engrained stereotype was the result of a very powerful social stigma that surrounds STIs like herpes in our society." (1) TEDx was created in the spirit of TED's mission, "ideas worth spreading." It supports independent organizers who want to create a TED-like event in their own community.





The American Sexual Health Association

notes that "while the emotional issues that accompany a diagnosis should be addressed, it is important not to overstate them nor assume everyone will respond in the same manner. While some people are shocked, 'angry,' and 'upset,' by an initial diagnosis ... not everyone is angry and miserable ... once a person has been educated about the virus, and has lived with the infection for some time, they're likely to have a different emotional outlook."

What other treatments are currently available for a herpes infection?

"Two types of antiviral treatments against HSV are available: topical and oral. The treatments include penciclovir, acyclovir, famciclovir, and valaciclovir. However, their effectiveness is limited. For instance, a meta-analysis of five placebo-controlled and two dose comparison studies evaluated the effect of aciclovir, famciclovir or valaciclovir on symptoms. The meta-analysis showed that oral antiviral therapy

decreases the duration and the associated pain of an outbreak by merely one day." (2) As noted above, there are also the natural anti-HSV remedies, Novirin and Gene-Eden-VIR.
