Maxine herself has dealt with the challenges of blended families when she remarried in 1975 to a man with three children.


"It was very difficult for us. We had no idea there would be so many emotions," recalls Maxine. "Everybody has a different expectation but they all want to be loved."

Maxine believes her goal is to help others "find a harmony within the whole." As a Christian life coach, she says bringing the Lord into the conversation is often beneficial to the process because the power of God's word and prayer can remove arguments from the equation.

"What does God want us to do? He says love one another, forgive one another. He leads us to enjoy life."

Rebuilding Families One Dollar at a Time, is a guide for shaping a positive financial future for every family.
