The Cuomo administration's actions and inactions have ensured that 911 emergency first responder medical and police services would not be immediately notified when the disabled are victims of physical and sexual assault crimes or have died suspiciously. Mandated reporters and witnesses continue to be directed to report suspected crimes, suspicious activities and deaths to Cuomo's State abuse hotline
