

American Kidney Fund Awards Clinical Scientist in Nephrology Fellowships to Dr. Anoop Sheshadri and Dr. Megan Yanik

Research will explore behavioral intervention in dialysis patients and genetic factors affecting immunosuppresants in kidney transplant patients

the University of California, San Francisco and Dr. Megan Yanik of the University of Alabama at Birmingham have been named Clinical Scientist in Nephrology (CSN) fellows by the American Kidney Fund (AKF), receiving grants to conduct research designed to improve treatment and outcomes for patients living with end-stage renal disease (ESRD).

Dr. Sheshadri's research, funded through a new partnership with Satellite Healthcare, will evaluate whether providing pedometers and recommended goals for steps per day to both hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis patients can improve their cardiovascular function and quality of life.

"This fellowship will further the care of a population of patients that is underrepresented in the research world," said Dr. Sheshadri. "I plan to learn how physical and cognitive dysfunction develops in ESRD patients as a first step in learning how best to prevent that decline and if possible, reverse it." The AKF-Satellite Healthcare Clinical Research Grant will fund Dr. Sheshadri's fellowship for two years.

Dr. Yanik will study genetic factors that may influence the time needed for the immunosuppressant drug tacrolimus to reach therapeutic levels in children with kidney transplants, as well as their role in risk for acute organ rejection.

"Knowledge gained from this work may help us to personalize immunosuppression medication choices for children and to improve clinical outcomes in the future," said Dr. Yanik. Dr. Yanik's AKF Clinical Scientist in Nephrology fellowship is funded by a grant from Sanofi.

The CSN program strives to improve the quality of care provided to kidney patients and promotes clinical research in nephrology. It enhances the training of nephrologists who want to pursue an academic career and whose primary professional commitment is to scholarship in the provision of patient care. Drs. Sheshadri and Yanik join a distinguished list of CSN fellows whose work in nephrology research has been advancing patient care since 1989.

"The American Kidney Fund's Clinical Scientist in Nephrology program has sponsored dozens of clinicians with one overarching goal: improving the care and treatment of patients with kidney disease," said LaVarne A.
