

## OnPage Critical Alerts via Microsoft Outlook

Using Microsoft Outlook rules, you can forward critical alerts to OnPage sent from monitoring infrastructure to Outlook. No more babysitting your email client.

This demonstration simulates the very type of scenario IT engineers encounter when an alert fires from a monitor. Every alert is email enabled so these tests very clearly demonstrate that if alerts are currently being

sent to Outlook they can easily be forwarded to an OnPage ID or an OnPage group.

As 4 out of 5 fortune 500 companies use the Microsoft suite, this demonstration is highly relevant. Any of these companies or smaller companies using Microsoft Office can have critical alerts easily forwarded to OnPage and ensure their alerts will arrive quickly and prominently.

The additional advantages of OnPage alerts are:

- · Secure alerting: All messaging is encrypted
- Persistent messaging for up to 8 hours: Also known as alert until read, alerts will continue for up to 8 hours before expiring
- Forwarding: Bring team members into important conversation through OnPage forwarding capabilities
- Prioritized messaging (High or low): Not all messages are created equal. Some messages require immediate attention (high priority) while some need attention but not right away (low priority)
- HIPAA compliance: All messages are HIPAA compliant
- Multiple ring tones and settings: Pick the ring tone you want to alert you
- Ability to add attachments: Include images or voice attachments to your message to enhance your meaning

In the future, OnPage will continue to pursue further integrations with various monitoring devices and softwares. However, knowing that the OnPage application can easily accept direct and forwarded emails, makes the outlook look quite rosy.
