


## Religion and business come together in Rio De Janeiro

At the conference, the business leaders shared their personal stories about promoting interfaith relations. The honorees were able to collaborate on how the business community can further promote peace, understanding and human rights.

Jonathan Berezovsky is the CEO and founder of Migraflix, a company that holds cultural education programs in Brazil. To him, business and interfaith relations go hand-in-hand.

"I think for business it's very important to involve in interfaith relations because for business it's very important to involve in integration. And when you want to get involved in the integration of society, you have to deal with different cultures and religions. If you're a business and your employees belong to different cultures and you don't manage to have a program to integrate your employees through understanding, this will cause big trouble for the employees and the company," Berezovsky said.

Dr. Mezoui says looking forward, education about different religions and cultures is crucial.

"It's trust – these are magic words that are very useful to do good things. So if you teach me how you think and what you want and gain my trust, we can progress," Dr. Mezoui said.

Dr. Mezoui shared the mission of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations at the conference.

"It's thanks to this conference that has seen the bridge – if we put religion and business together, they have the same challenges and the same objectives."

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
