Different types of hard wood floor damage can often times be dealt with through hard wood floor restorations. It is important that residents be educated on it. In this article we want to discuss problems such as Cratering and what is called Crawling to better educate the homeowners that want to keep their hard wood floors beautiful and long lasting.

Cratering

This is the formation of small bowlshaped depressions that can occur in the finish of the wood floor. This is simply the contamination of the wood floor itself or the finish. The cure for this can be





hand-sanding the wood floor or the finish. You can also sand by using a small electric random orbital sander, and then abrade and re-coat the floor. Often, hand sanding will leave an unevenness or dip in the finish on the floor. To eliminate the low spots, spot finishing the areas may be necessary before the entire floor is recoated (this will also prove if the fix takes care of the contamination problem). "If the problem is widespread, the floor may need to be completely re-sanded," says Allman. "In which case, Royal Wood Floors can be contacted for a free estimate," he continues.

If it is determined that the problem is caused by contaminants between the boards, trowel-filling the floor may help prevent problems. When you suspect that there is a chance of contamination on the floor, make sure you first clean the floor thoroughly before you attempt to abrade and refinish the floor.

Crawling

Crawling is basically a defect in which the finish recedes from small areas of the surface of the floor. leaving them apparently un-coated. The cause is the contamination of the floor or finish. The cure would be to hand-sand the problem areas or just use a small electric random orbital sander. Then abrade and recoat the floor. If the problem is widespread, the floor may need to be completely re-sanded. If it is determined that the problem is caused by contaminants between the boards, trowel-filling the floor may help prevent this from happening again. When you suspect that there is a chance of contamination on the floor, make sure that you first clean the floor thoroughly before you attempt to abrade and refinish the floor. This will help solve the problem and prevent it from happening again.

"The best way to prevent problems is to always do the research first or seek professional help. Then problems such as the ones described here can be prevented," says Allman.
