Guberman's resume is lengthy and includes professional and international community accomplishments. Born in Romania, her family immigrated to Canada in 1960. After completing undergraduate & graduate work at McGill University in Montréal (Canada), as also at Washington University in Saint Louis, Missouri (U.S.A.) and at the University of Ottawa (Canada), Guberman went on to found CAMLI Corporation (1987-2001), a company that consulted with schools and colleges on the implementation of digital language tools. Guberman's career in public service didn't begin until the late 1990s when she contemporaneously returned to her home country of Romania as a NATO Director.

Thereafter, Guberman got her start in judicial service. Guberman was appointed to the role of Justice of the Peace by Ontario's Attorney General in February of 2007 and served as a Justice of the Peace in the Province of Ontario until December of 2012.

SolangeGuberman.com reflects Guberman's vibrant and multifaceted experience as both a professional and a public official. In addition to surveying Guberman's past, the site will also serve as a hub for information about her present and future. Over the years—and especially since the conclusion of her time as a Justice of the Peace—Guberman has made a point of becoming involved with a range of causes and charities near and dear to her heart. These causes range from the Campaign to End Violence Against Women and Girls to the Syrian Refugee Sponsorship Program at the University of Ottawa. Guberman's new website will include details and updates about her participation in these and other causes.

Currently Solange Guberman is interested in bringing to light numerous issues that affect women on a daily basis but are rarely addressed in the political arena. These issues include protection and housing for women who have been victims of sexual aggression, the prevalence of sexual cyberaggression on the web and the paucity of French services (such as bilingual police or hospital support) in the Ottawa area.

Guberman's new website will help shine a light on the former Justice of the Peace's ongoing pursuits and causes. The site will provide blog posts and updates from Guberman herself, as well as relevant news posts, mission statement information, articles, links to resources pertaining to Guberman's causes - and more.

"I am excited to unveil this new website, both as a way to communicate with the Canadian public and as a personal venue to discuss my goals and aspirations," Guberman said. "My hope is that the new site will allow me to draw attention to some of the urgent issues facing our country today - from the 'Precarious Status and Fear of Deportation of Abused Immigrant Women' to 'Violence against Women & Girls with Disabilities' as also to the controversial and very current debate on 'Medically-Assisted Dying."
