After "Chuck made his forecast, the crowd of people at the <u>Staten Island Zoo</u> cheered, and then New York City Public Advocate Letitia James unfurled the "Spring is Coming" banner. The Staten Island. Zoo's annual Groundhog Day event is sponsored by <u>Investors Bank</u>.
