"The workshop will help senior management and teams involved in GDPR compliance get a better understanding of the key requirements of the Regulation, what they need to do about data breaches under the GDPR, policies and procedures to respond to data breaches, and the requirements for notifying a data breach," Alan Calder continued.

The conference is generic across all trades, with hands-on and practical parallel sessions on the GDPR, third-party compliance, audit committees, IT security, and bribery, fraud and corruption issues.
