They also don't have access to educational literature about Parkinson's in the languages they understand. In many cultures, symptoms of Parkinson's disease are wrongly attributed to ageing, and therefore many patients remain undiagnosed and thus untreated.

World Parkinson's Program believes that a campaign involving world leaders will have a global impact on the cause of Parkinson's disease. World Parkinson's Program is a Canadian based charitable organization dedicated to improving the daily lives of Parkinson's patients and their access to better treatment for Parkinson's at a global level.

World Parkinson's Program is the only organization which provides medications, walking aids, and educational literature about Parkinson's disease in more than 20 languages, which are used in almost 50 countries. World Parkinson's Program was founded in 2008, and has chapters in many countries across the globe.
