Gooding, at ten years old, was sent to his brother's agent's office to pick up a script. "My life was instantly changed when Cuba's agent the Coralie Jr Theatrical Agency discovered me," he said. "After months of begging my mom, I was allowed to go on an audition." With no prior theatrical training, Gooding landed two auditions in one day and booked one of them.

"The rest, as they say, is history," said Gooding. He has played in memorable roles that are iconic in pop culture and has influenced generations.

Gooding's career took off when he landed a series regular role for three years on a Nickelodeon TV show, "Wild and Crazy Kids," followed by a five-year run on the ABC network series, "Hanging with Mr. Cooper," and then a three-year run on the WB network series, "Smart Guy." After years on television, it was a natural progression for Gooding to act in the movies.

"The turning point in my career was when I starred in a major motion picture for Paramount Pictures, "Baby Boy," opposite Ving Rhames, Tyrese Gibson, Snoop Dogg, and Taraji P. Henson," said Gooding. He received critical praise for his role as "Sweatpea." The movie and TV roles continued for Gooding and he became a household name.
