\* An employee of a skilled nursing facility or nursing home that is involved overbilling Medicare with unnecessary medical procedures-on a daily basis.

\* An employee or insider with proof a cardiology group in Minnesota that is performing unnecessary cardiac catheterizations on their patients.

\* An employee of a 'Sleep Center' in Minnesota that is gouging Medicare with significant up-coding or for medical procedures that never took place or procedures that were medically unnecessary.

\* A ER doctor anywhere in Minnesota who has proof their hospital/employer is billing Medicare for unneeded medical procedures or admissions on a very regular basis

Our statewide initiative is focused on identifying whistleblower with significant Medicare fraud/overbilling throughout Minnesota including communities such as Minneapolis, Saint Paul, Rochester, Duluth, Bloomington, Brooklyn Park, Plymouth, or Saint Cloud.

Simple rules for a whistleblower from the Minnesota Corporate Whistleblower Center: Do not go to the government first if you are a potential whistleblower with substantial proof of wrongdoing. The Minnesota Corporate Whistleblower Center says, "Major whistleblowers frequently go to the government thinking they will help. It's a huge mistake. Do not go to the news media with your whistleblower information. Public revelation of a whistleblower's information could destroy any prospect for a reward. Do not try to force a company/employer or individual to come clean about significant Medicare fraud, overbilling the federal government for services never rendered, multi-million-dollar state or federal tax evasion, or a Minnesota based company falsely claiming to be a minority owned business to get preferential treatment on federal or state projects. Come to us first, tell us what type of information you have, and if we think it's sufficient, we will help you with a focus on you getting rewarded."

Unlike any group in the US the Corporate Whistleblower Center can assist a potential whistleblower with packaging or building out their information to potentially increase the reward potential.
