


Author Annie Jones Holmes to be Featured on CUTV News Radio

Originally a playwright, Holmes adapted her plays into the short stories collected in Beneath the Willow.



"I call it a "divine revelation." I can sit and write words like many leaves on the trees, like the birds flying. I sit down and my fingers just fly," says Holmes. "It's my creative imagination. I dig deep into my mind and come up with what I would think about this situation. In order to reach the people, I had to go deep within myself and put myself right there in that moment."

"I enjoy the short stories, because it keeps the people going. They begin reading and they can't put it down. Short stories inspire you to go into the next one. Sometimes with a long story, you get bored, unless it's a juicy piece of literature. So, the short story invites them to read on to the next story to see what happens."

And the response from readers has been overwhelmingly positive.

"They love it because it's full of humor," says Holmes. "And this inspires me to continue. I like telling of the trials of drama. The book explained the variety of trials that those people went through, and the drama. I tell people that

Drama, is experience of life's incidents. So, the book, although it is fiction, reveals a realistic concept of life."




