Caldwell says "pictures of everyday Houstonians tell a story of remarkable human kindness and courage in response to unbelievable human suffering."

"All you want to say is "How can I help?" after seeing and hearing this heartfelt performance by Larry Caldwell. The visual takes you to the heart of the tragedy, and the beautiful song stirs compassion for the victims of Hurricane Harvey," said Bobby Watson, former bassist for Rufus and Chaka Khan.

"Larry Caldwell channels the soul of Leon Russell as he sings up a storm for hurricane relief," said writer-director Brian Lane ("Remington Steele," "MacGyver").

Caldwell explains, "The aim of the video is to honor the victims and heroes of Hurricane Harvey, and to help raise money for the relief effort through The Red Cross, Save the Children, Musicares, and the Humane Society."

"We're donating all proceeds from the video to these charities," said Caldwell.

"Trillions of gallons of water fell on Houstonians, damaging seventy per cent of their homes."

"They need all the human kindness we can show them."
