Applications must be submitted to the Recreation and Parks Department (615 South McClelland Street) by Wednesday, October 24th.

This year's festival includes a Catrines and Catrinas Contest. Dress up in the spirit of the Day of the Dead. Prizes will be given to the best ensemble. Participants can register onsite.
