

# Vaginoplasty restores tightness after childbirth and aging

*Vaginoplasty is used by women who want to tighten or improve the looks of the genital area after going through other medical procedures or having children.*

"Childbirth is a major reason for this procedure. Many women suffer perineal tears or have that area slightly cut to ease a baby out of the birth canal. It does heal, but it does not always heal in a way that restores the original dimensions," Dr. Stanton said.

Age is another reason for opting for this procedure. Dr. Stanton said as people age their muscles and skin naturally become looser. The [vaginoplasty](#) tightens the vaginal walls.

"Primarily this is about sex," he said. "Tight walls increase the friction during intercourse. Some surgeons say this also increase a woman's sexual response and enjoyment. That may happen, but it is rare."

Other reasons for the surgery are problems with the lower abdomen including chronic constipation and pelvic surgeries. Dr. Stanton said the vaginoplasty helps relieve problems created by other surgery processes.

For most people, this is an esthetic surgery.

"It is your body. You can change it you want to," he said. "It is no one business but yours and your partner's. If the two of you think it is a good idea, then schedule a consultation visit and discuss it with me."
