

Deschutes Brewery's Street Pub Program Raises More Than \$1 Million for Nonprofits

Bend, Oregon brewery wraps up its third year of touring the country with the world's largest pop-up pub

BEND, OR, USA, November 9, 2017 /EINPresswire.com/ -- <u>Deschutes</u> <u>Brewery</u>'s Street Pub finished out its third annual national tour this year, bringing the total raised for nonprofits to \$1,047,860 in just three years. In that time, the 400-foot-long traveling pop-up pub visited 13 cities across the country and welcomed more than 300,000 beer fans who turned out to drink more than 2,800 kegs of damn tasty beer, all while raising money for nonprofits in their hometowns.

The 2017 tour, which just wrapped up last month, visited the following cities and supported these charity partners:

- Sacramento, CA Runnin' for Rhett

"We've always been committed to giving back to the local communities where we sell our beer," said Michael Lalonde, CEO of Deschutes Brewery. "This program gave us a way to support causes and organizations in every place we visited, and we're proud that so many fans turned out to support this program over the years, helping us surpass the \$1 million mark."

Street Pub was created by the brewery to bring the pub experience, on which Deschutes was founded 29 years ago, to fans across the country. In addition to the money donated through the Street Pub program, Deschutes will donate more than \$300,000 to other community programs this year, totaling more than half a million for 2017 alone.
