Telecommunications Costa Rica Market 2017 - Current and Future Plans

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Costa Rica's telecom and pay-TV services market will grow from an estimated \$1.7bn in 2017 to \$1.9bn by 2022 at a CAGR of 2.0% over 2017-2022 driven by projected growth in mobile data, fixed broadband and pay-TV segments. Mobile voice will be the largest revenue-contributing segment in 2017 but will see its share of total revenue decline over the forecast period. Mobile data revenue will expand at the fastest CAGR of 11.6% over 2017-2022, driven by growing consumption of online videos and social media applications on mobile devices in line with rising smartphone penetration and growing adoption of 3G/4G services.

- ICE (Kolbi) leads the Costa Rica's mobile market in terms of mobile subscriptions for 2017, followed by Movistar Costa Rica. Both operators compete on the basis of network expansions/upgrades and competitively priced offers to strengthen their market position.
