Almack is quoted elaborating, "A family member has benefited from specialized reading instructional programs, with dramatic and lasting results." Almack has watched his family member grow as a person from the programs offered to them by the International Dyslexia Association. The association offers a plethora of options to those struggling with dyslexia. One of those great programs is a monthly dyslexia support group, also known as The Dallas Dyslexia Information Group (DDIG).

Another movement associated with the IDA is TeamQuest. The IDA has been quoted explaining their goals behind creating TeamQuest, "Our goal is that all stakeholders will realize their full potential and advance our destiny. We focus on educating parents, teachers, and professionals about dyslexia, assuring that structured literacy is embedded in educator training and providing the opportunity for all people to learn to read." The program puts on several fund-raising events during the year to gain support and understanding of dyslexia with the proceeds going to programs which bring people together "to help create a better future for every child and adult who struggles with dyslexia and other reading difficult because reading changes lives!
