Animal shelters, rescue groups,

sanctuaries and other nonprofit organizations whose work includes helping senior dogs are invited to apply for Grey Muzzle grants. Grant applications will be accepted from February 16 – March 16, 2018. Grants typically range from \$2,500 to \$7,500.

These grants provide senior dogs with medical and dental care, adoption, foster and hospice programs, and assistance to prevent them from being surrendered to shelters, among other lifesaving programs.

Citing a survey of Grey Muzzle grantees that reported more people are adopting older dogs, Lunghofer feels the situation for senior dogs has recently improved, but noted, "Many wonderful old dogs are waiting in shelters right now for somebody like you to adopt them."

"Opening your heart and home to a senior dog is a deeply

rewarding experience. Older dogs who have lost their families are especially grateful for a second chance to love and be loved again," she said.

The dogs aren't the only ones who are grateful. "We're very thankful for the support of our donors, who make it possible for Grey Muzzle to fund many worthy groups working hard to save and improve
