



Ramon Rodriguez-Cruz, MD & Chief of Neurology at Orlando VA to Speak About Parkinson's Disease at PMDAAlliance Conference

ORLANDO, FL, UNITED STATES, May 8, 2018 /EINPresswire.com/ -- According to the US Department of Veterans Affairs website, veterans with Parkinson's disease who were exposed to herbicides during their service may be eligible for disability compensation and health care. Surviving spouses, dependent children, and dependent parents of veterans who were exposed to herbicides during their service and died as the result of complications due to Parkinson's disease may be eligible for survivors' benefits.

While the cause of Parkinson disease remains unknown, there is indication that for some people the disease is triggered by the intersection of certain toxins and hazardous chemicals with a predisposing genetic factor. Recognition of this connection is part of the reason that the VA established Parkinson's Disease Research, Education, and Clinical Centers (PADRECC) to serve various regions of the country.
